Delivery of FMSC food to rural village in Liberia

The weakened global economy has devastated people around the world who **are already** suffering from natural and man-made disasters, poverty, disease, and malnutrition. It has also stretched our resources like never before. So far we've been able to continue sending food, pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, clothing, and other critical aid to people in crisis in places like Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Sudan, Uganda, Sierra Leone and Haiti. International Children's Fund works to meet the desperate needs of countless impoverished children, pulling them away from the brink of starvation, disease, and victimization.

Last summer, you read about a large food shipment that we sent to Liberia. We are thrilled to say that we have more than **quadrupled** the amount of food shipments we are sending this year. Thank you for helping us to make that happen!

The shipments are a temporary life saving tool that ultimately opens doors to share the gospel and make an eternal difference in the lives of many. **We could not continue serving those in need without your generous help.**

One of the containers of relief aid you helped us ship in the last month landed in Monrovia, Liberia. The container held 36 pallets of meals, donated to us from Feed My

Starving Children, — 1,188 boxes, 36 meals per box — 710,496 TOTAL MEALS and was divided to distribute to four of our pastors. Pastor Ralph Gelego distributed the much-needed food to support his existing orphanage, elementary and vocational school. He also travels into rural areas to help families in need.

In addition to distributing food, clothing, medicine and safe drinking water, Pastor Paasewe at Living Word Community Church is building medical clinics and churches in the rural areas around the capital of Monrovia. He is able to distribute the much needed food in the rural areas of Liberia and see where real need is. The area he touches is not visited with support and he is truly saving lives.

Pastor Momo Cole of Harvest Time Ministries is establishing farms to feed the needy, as well as publishing educational materials, and a program focused on assisting AIDS victims. People are dying everyday from malnutrition and dehydration. The much needed supply of food is making a tremendous difference in the lives of those suffering from HIV Aids and other diseases.

Pastor Emmanuel Gyamfi assists people at the New Community Clinic in Liberia. Pastor Emmanuel shared that in one month's time they may see over 1,200 people. Due to the high cost of medical equipment, drugs, medical supplies, and food, they are not able to help people as much as they would like. When the 10 beds are occupied and they have more emergencies, they are forced to tell patients to go to another place or refer them. Most of the time the patients refuse, cry and lie on the floor to receive treatment because they believe that the physical and spiritual needs will be met at the clinic. The food that was sent to their aid is helping countless people and they thank the supporters of International Children's Fund.

Here is a note from Pastor Emmanuel:

The people of my village were so happy to receive support; that words were not enough to express to the donors of ICF. People came from all over and formed long lines to collect their MannaPack™ Rice and supplies.

In so doing, they have asked to express their heartfelt thanks and appreciation to the donors of these blessings and pray that our great Lord richly bless the source.

With much thanks and appreciation and let God be praised!


