


Fiscal Management

A Grass-Roots Volunteer Based Organization – Dedicated to helping those less fortunate

Brief Description



International Children's Fund (ICF) is a 501c3 non-profit organization that provides humanitarian aid to desperately poor children and their families throughout the world.

ICF has grown from one man's mission to help starving children, to an organization that literally spans the globe. For more than 40 years, ICF has partnered with a network of highly dedicated indigenous pastors who serve as our eyes and caring hands within the local communities. These pastors identify the greatest needs within their villages and then work closely with ICF to request, receive, process, and distribute our lifesaving aid. There is no bureaucracy, just dedicated people who are committed to making a difference in the lives of those who need it the most.

ICF's goal is to make a sustainable improvement in the lives of those that we serve. As such we split our programs into two categories - programs that sustain life (food, clothing, and medicine) and programs that create local skills or capabilities toward self-sufficiency. As an analogy, we provide fish to those who are hungry and also teach people how to fish so that they never go hungry again.

Sustaining Life



During 2016, ICF supplied more than \$52 million of lifesaving food, clothing and medicine to seven missions in three African countries.

Food & Water – We shipped more than 300,000 lbs. of dehydrated food and also provided funds for local food purchases. It was valued in excess of \$588,000. ICF has continued to provide clean drinking water to rural areas by drilling water wells. Did you know that we will match dollar for dollar your donation, up to \$30,000, for our water well project? Clothing – Clothing and shoes are not mass produced in Africa and so are relatively scarce and expensive. Our dedicated volunteers collect used clothing and shoes from throughout our community, pack and ship them to our missions for distribution. During 2016, we shipped more than \$500,000 worth of clothing and shoes in support of our missions.

Medicine – Medicine in Africa is in extremely short supply and is simply too expensive for most of the people who desperately need it. During 2016, through the generous support of various pharmaceutical suppliers, we were able to obtain and ship medicines sufficient to treat more than 435,000 people who were suffering from illnesses ranging from malaria to AIDS, valued at over \$49 million, along with approximately 16,000 lifesaving mosquito nets.

Building for the Future

We recognize that our goal is to make a sustainable improvement in the lives touched by our missions and as such we have numerous programs designed to provide the training and resources needed to promote self-sufficiency within the communities that we serve.

Education – This is the key to self-sufficiency. During 2016, ICF has supported numerous projects to construct and equip elementary schools, middle schools, vocational schools and the continued support of libraries. From rural Liberia to the Kibera slums, ICF has supported the construction/renovation of schools and the supply of school equipment and countless books.



Commerce – ICF has supported numerous projects to create micro-commerce within the communities that we serve ranging from the supply of equipment or materials to the purchase of land for farming. These programs allow an individual or a community to generate an income to support themselves and then progressively to support others.
