ANOTHER GREAT YEAR

During 2021, ICF supplied **more than \$68 million** in lifesaving food, medicine, and other services to thousands of needy children and their families. This aid was carefully delivered to those in greatest need through fifteen ministry partners in Liberia, Ghana, Kenya, Uganda, Togo, Pakistan, and India.

CLEAN WATER CHANGES LIVES

Polluted water isn't just dirty; it can be **deadly**. In 2021, ICF drilled thirteen new wells providing safe, clean drinking water to villages where this vital resource was not previously available. This freshwater means health, safety, and a better local economy for an estimated 40,000 villagers in some of the most impoverished areas of Africa, India, and Pakistan.



HOPE FOR THE HUNGRY

Nearly half of childhood deaths in Africa are due to starvation. During 2021, this food crisis was exacerbated by the COVID pandemic and tremendous supply chain issues. ICF responded to this crisis by supplying nearly 1.25 million nutritious meals while also investing heavily in sustainable food programs including agriculture, animal husbandry, and a fish farm. Each of these sustainable programs is designed to support the needs of the local mission and to provide a source of micro-commerce as surplus production is sold into the local community.

BETTER HEALTH AND HEALING

Medicine in Africa is in extremely short supply and too expensive for most of the people who desperately need it. During 2021, we provided over 3 million doses of medicines to treat people suffering from illnesses ranging from malaria to AIDS.

Through our ministry partners, we offered deworming and jigger eradication to thousands of vulnerable children. We also distributed 33,000 insecticide-treated mosquito nets to protect people from malaria.

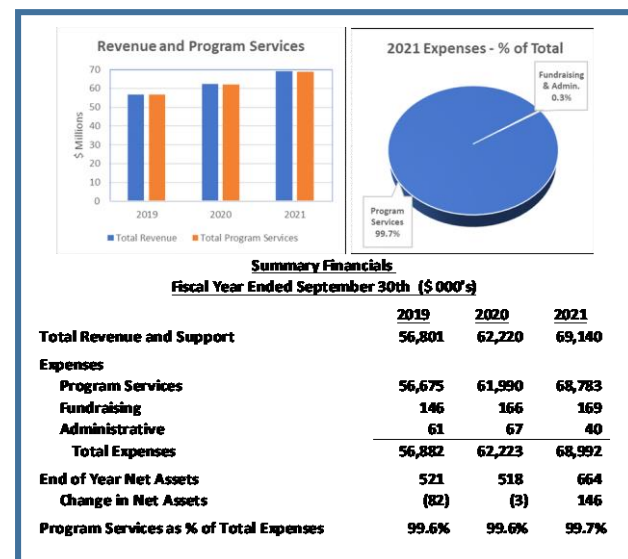
EDUCATION AND COMMERCE

Education and training are the keys to creating self-sufficiency and a better life. During 2021, ICF supported the construction of school facilities in Togo, Ghana, and Kibera, along with the supply of schoolbooks and other educational materials. We also initiated the construction of a Girls College in Liberia. This will empower tens of thousands of young women to break the chains of poverty and gender inequality.

FISCAL MANAGEMENT

ICF is committed to being good stewards of our talents and resources. We take our responsibility as a Christian charity very seriously and work diligently to identify the most efficient, cost-effective means of securing and delivering humanitarian aid to those in greatest need.

During 2021, more than 99.7% of our total expenses were for program services.
