ANOTHER GREAT YEAR

During 2024, ICF supplied more than \$97.3 million in lifesaving food, medicine, and other services to tens of thousands of needy children and their families. This aid was carefully delivered to those in greatest need through fifteen ministry partners in Liberia, Ghana, Kenya, Uganda, Togo, Pakistan, and India.



CLEAN WATER CHANGES LIVES

Polluted water isn't just dirty; it can be deadly. During 2024, ICF drilled twenty-three new wells providing safe, clean drinking water to villages where this vital resource was not previously available. This freshwater means health, safety, and a better local economy for more than 50,000 villagers in some of the most impoverished areas of Africa, India, and Pakistan.

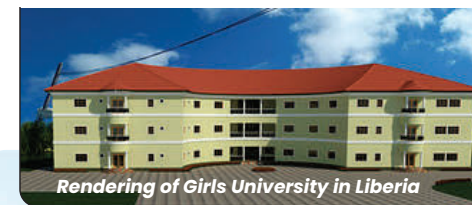
HOPE FOR THE HUNGRY

Nearly half of childhood deaths in Africa are due to starvation. During 2024 ICF delivered more than **1.6 million nutritious meals** while also investing heavily in sustainable food programs including agriculture, animal husbandry, and fish farms. Each of these sustainable programs is designed to support the needs of the local mission and to provide a source of micro-commerce as surplus production is sold into the local community.

BETTER HEALTH AND HEALING

Medicine in Africa is in extremely short supply and too expensive for most of the people who desperately need it. During 2024, we provided approximately **3.7 million doses of medicines to treat people suffering from illnesses ranging from malaria to AIDS.**

Through our ministry partners, we offered deworming and jigger eradication to thousands of vulnerable children. **We completed the construction of a new medical clinic in Togo and also distributed 35,000 insecticide-treated mosquito nets to protect people from malaria.**



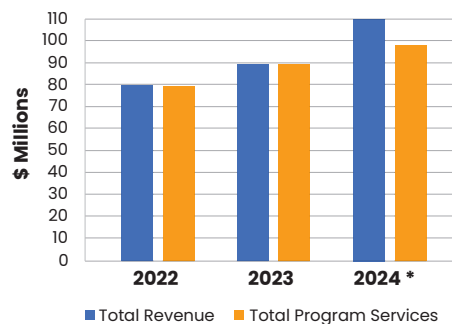
EDUCATION AND COMMERCE

Education and training are the keys to creating self-sufficiency and a better life. During 2024, we made **significant progress on the construction of our new Girls College in Liberia.** The construction is expected to be completed during 2025 and classes are expected to begin in the fall. This project will empower tens of thousands of young women to break the chains of poverty and gender inequality.
